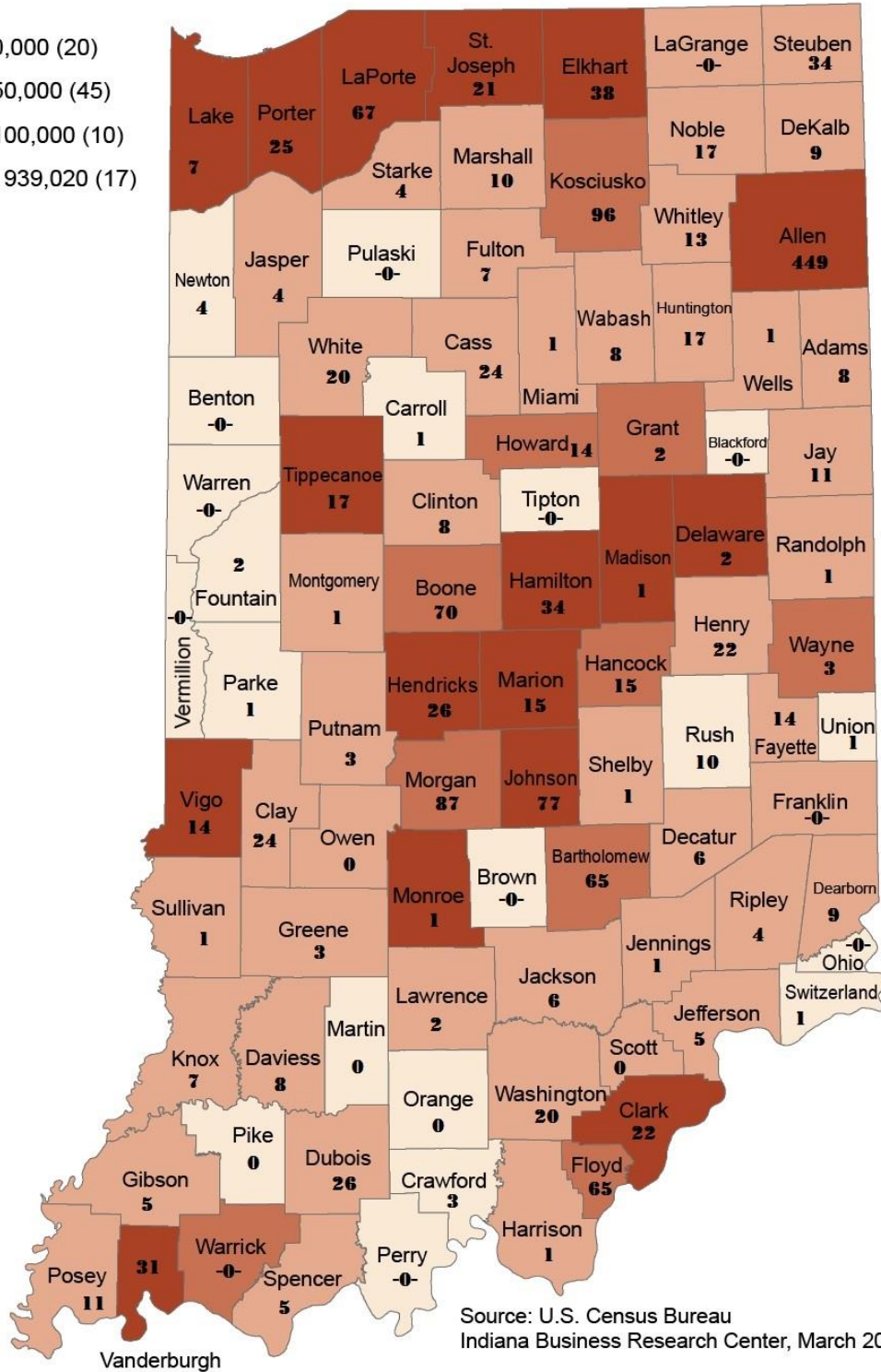

Top 12 Counties where the victim gives a medical history of sexual assault, receives a medical forensic examination that includes the collection of evidence with a rape kit, but law enforcement closes the case as “No Crime/False Crime” even though the history given to the medical provider who collected the kit is sufficient to establish the probable cause needed to test the kit.

UNFOUNDED, I.E., FALSE OR BASELESS COMPLAINTS

“Occasionally, an agency will receive a complaint that is determined through investigation to be false or baseless. In other words, no crime occurred. If the investigation shows that no offense occurred nor was attempted, UCR Program procedures dictate that the reported offense must be unfounded” **Example:** A woman claimed that a man attempted to rape her in his automobile. When law enforcement personnel talked to both individuals, the complainant admitted that she had exaggerated and that the man did not attempt to rape her. **“The recovery of stolen property, the low value of stolen property, the refusal of the victim to cooperate, the failure to make an arrest does not unfound a legitimate offense.”** *Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook* (2004), pp. 77-78
