ANTI-DEMAND WORKING GROUP 2019

OBJECTIVES

- Develop a 5-year strategic plan for a comprehensive initiative that focuses on demand reduction for both commercial sex and labor trafficking, with outcomes measurement tools and that can be replicated by other cities/states.
- Identify 2-3 top legislative priorities for 2020 and develop a policy brief to provide to relevant stakeholders.
- Create and deliver 60-90 minute anti-demand presentations to at least 5 relevant stakeholders.
- Provide at least 1 law enforcement anti-demand training.
- Research/monitor grant opportunities and best practices for buyer accountability and demand reduction.

MEMBER EXPECTATIONS

The IPATH Taskforce ADWG is comprised of survivor leaders, civil and criminal law enforcement, advocacy groups, service providers, researchers, business and community leaders. The Anti-Demand Working Group will work to develop, implement, and evaluate anti-demand initiatives in the state.

ADWG Member expectations

- Meetings

The expectation of the IPATH Anti-Demand Working Group Chairs is that members will attend **4/6 meetings per year**, either via conference call or in person. We meet for **2 hours, 6 times a year**.

You will also be **asked to contribute** some additional time or expertise to **1 working group project** of your choosing each year. Project-based participation is based on your capacity. Some folks have given a lot of hours, some have given 2-3 extra hours; regardless, all help facilitate movement for the taskforce and the committee's mission and vision.

Potential Projects included:

- Present at IPATH/IPATH member HT events and training series for multi-disciplinary audiences
- Research of new or existing anti-demand initiatives/legislation
- HT Training creation and/or HT Training delivery for key stakeholders
- Public awareness campaigns

We believe that sex-buying is the primary driver of the commercial sex industry, that demand reduction is an essential element of combating sex trafficking, and that the implementation of demand reduction tactics must be evidence-driven, survivor-informed, and victim-centered.
