The Labor Trafficking Committee of IPATH is a committee comprised of law enforcement, advocacy groups, service providers, worker organizers, and community leaders who seek to increase training and awareness of labor trafficking in Indiana among relevant stakeholders for the purpose of:

- Increasing victim identification;
- Identifying the current capacity of Indiana to serve, protect, and empower identified victims and survivors of labor trafficking;
- Facilitating collaboration to fill gaps in services for survivors of labor trafficking, in particular, transitional housing and culturally and linguistically competent case management;
- Educating vulnerable populations to prevent exploitation and increase reporting. These populations include, but are not limited to: immigrants, refugees; low-wage, migrant, and seasonal workers;
- Holistically supporting survivors who seek justice through the court system to empower witness testimony on behalf of the prosecution.

## **LABOR TRAFFICKING COMMITTEE 2019 OBJECTIVES**

- Partner with each regional coalition on at least one event
- Train 20 different law enforcement agencies, including at least 5 new agencies
- Plan one outreach or education event with another committee
- Partner with at least one other committee to develop a new training
- Recruit at least 5 new members, including a shelter or housing agency, worker center, and immigrant rights group
- Deliver 2 Labor Trafficking (LT) TOTs in 2019 outside of Marion Co.
- Create LT webinar in Spanish and English and upload to IPATH Taskforce website
- Expand LTC membership geographically

The expectation of the IPATH Labor Trafficking Committee Chairs is that members will **attend 4 out of 6 meetings per year**, either via conference call or in person.

We meet for **2 hours, 6 times per year**.

(We meet the 3rd Wednesday of even-numbered months from 2-4pm.)

You will also be **asked to contribute** some additional time or expertise to **1 committee project** of your choosing each year. Project-based participation is based on your capacity. Some folks have given a lot of hours, some have given 2-3 extra hours; regardless, all help facilitate movement for this committee's mission and vision.

In 2018, some of those projects included:

- Developing a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for all LT Committee members;
- Delivering labor trafficking training to community partners, law enforcement agencies, and services providers;
- Participating in an awareness event with Committee partners and relevant community leaders;
- Creating informational materials in Spanish and English with which organizations can conduct outreach, education and other services to vulnerable communities;

*We believe that through multidisciplinary collaboration, we will make committee members more efficient and effective at labor trafficking identification, protection, and service provision. We also believe that through this approach we will see an increase in successful investigations and prosecutions.*
